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1. Overview of Total Credits: The minimum graduation requirement is 128 credits, including: Required General Education Courses (26 credits: Practical Life English I & II, Chinese Reading and Writing I & II, Physical Education I & II, Club Learning and Teamwork I & II, Life Education and Sustainable Development, Programming and Logical Computation, Introduction to Long-Term Care, Introduction to Artificial Intelligence, Creative Thinking and Practical Applications, Tajen Social Responsibility

and Practice, Service-Learning Education); Elective General Education Courses (6 credits total; College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences students must complete at least 2 credits in Social Sciences; College of Leisure and Hospitality Management & College of Humanities and Information Technology students must complete at least 2 credits in Natural Sciences; remaining credits may be taken across any general education elective category); College Required Courses (10 credits); Interdisciplinary Module Required Courses (8 credits); Professional Required Courses (42 credits); Professional Elective Courses (at least 36 credits, which can include up to 12 recognized credits from non-departmental courses, excluding general education courses).

2.Course Specifics & English Placement:All-Out National Defense Education Military Training for Years 1-2 (I,II,III,IV,V) are electives(0 credits/2 hours each, totaling 0 credits /10 hours); Year 1 Physical Education (I & II) are required (2 credits / 2 hours each, totaling 4 credits / 4 hours); Year 1 Club Learning and Teamwork (I & II) are required (1 credit / 1 hour each, totaling 2 credits / 2 hours); Year 1 Life Education and Sustainable Development is required (1 credit / 1 hour); Year 2 Service-Learning Education is required (1 credit / 1 hour). English instruction is leveled into Levels A, B, and C.

3.Internship Requirements:The internship carries 9 credits and requires a minimum of 720 hours.

4.Semester Credit Limits by Academic Year:Years 1-3 require a minimum of 16 credits and a maximum of 25 credits per semester; Year 4 requires a minimum of 9 credits and a maximum of 25 credits per semester.

5.Upon completing 16 credits of the Grief Care Program, students will be issued a certificate as a "Professional Specialist in Life Rites and Grief Counseling."

6.▲ (Compulsory) / △ (Elective): Specialized funeral service courses required for applying for a Funeral Director Certificate pursuant to the "Regulations Governing Funeral Directors."

☆: Courses related to the department's "Life Ceremony and Grief Counseling Program."

7.Graduation Benchmarks & Supporting Measures:English Proficiency: Students must pass an elementary-level standardized English proficiency test. Those who do not pass may take the "Elementary English Proficiency" remedial course; completing the course with a passing grade fulfills this benchmark. (Please refer to the university's Implementation Guidelines for English Proficiency Courses).

Professional Competency:Students must obtain at least a Level C Technician Certificate in Funeral Services during their undergraduate studies. (Please refer to the program's Graduation Benchmark and Recognition Regulations).
